Day 1: Overnight Flight

Your adventure begins with an overnight flight to Italy. Journey through southern Italy and experience its rich scenery, art, culture, food, and wine.

Day 2: Rome, Italy

Your tour opens in the "Eternal City" of Rome! As arrival times will vary, there is no scheduled sightseeing today. Spend the day as you wish, exploring the city independently. Tonight, join your fellow travelers for a welcome dinner celebrating the start of your Italian journey. *Today dinner will be included.*

Day 3: Rome

Begin your exploration of the Eternal City with an expert-guided tour of Rome's Renaissance and Baroque highlights. Climb to the top of the Spanish Steps for views of the city's skyline and down its famous 135 stairs. Stroll over cobblestone streets and weathered passageways to discover famous sights such as the Trevi Fountain and the Pantheon's imposing facade. Finish a full morning of exploration in the oval-shaped Piazza Navona, built upon the site of the ancient Stadium of Domitian. Make the most of a free afternoon in Italy's capital city. Perhaps you'll meander through Rome's lively *Monti* district to soak in the local life. *Today breakfast will be included.*

Day 4: Rome - Pompeii - Sorrento

Journey to the Sorrentine Peninsula, an iconic coastline of rocky beaches and towering cliffs. En route, pause at a local winery to savor the area's famous *Lacryma Christi*. Enjoy a typical lunch before experiencing the eerily

preserved ruins of Pompeii your way, because **it's your choice!** Join a local guide for an in-depth tour of Pompeii's best-known monuments **-OR-** venture further afield to discover the hidden corners of this vast archeological site. In the late afternoon, settle into your hotel in Sorrento.* Take some time to explore the property, perched in a scenic location above town and sea. As dusk falls, the Bay of Naples lights up with the twinkling lights from the towns along its coast. As you settle into your home for the next five nights, you might even catch a glimpse of Mount Vesuvius in the distance, the volcano that famously erupted and buried Pompeii. *Today breakfast and lunch will be included.*

Day 5: Sorrento - Amalfi Coast - Sorrento

Sail** along the stunning Amalfi Coast to Positano, with its pastel-colored houses and pebbly beaches. Spend time in this legendary locale, browsing the posh boutiques or relaxing along the beach before continuing to Amalfi. A former trading hub, Amalfi is now a quiet coastal town of historic landmarks and a black-and-white marble cathedral. Explore on your own before returning to your hotel for an evening at leisure. *Today breakfast will be included.*

Day 6: Sorrento

This morning, head out to the countryside of Sant'Agata sui Due Golfi for a fun morning at a traditional terraced farmhouse, perched high and overlooking the Amalfi Coast. Visit the vegetable garden of this family-owned farm and join in a hands-on cooking class following family recipes. Then, dig into a delicious lunch you helped make, a true taste of the traditional dishes of the region. Return to Sorrento for an afternoon and

evening at leisure. Wander through its narrow streets, colorful boutiques, or perhaps sample some gelato made with local lemons. *Today breakfast and lunch will be included.*

Day 7: Sorrento

Spend the day exploring a Mediterranean paradise on the sparkling Bay of Naples. A 30-minute ferryboat takes you from Sorrento to the legendary Isle of Capri. Upon arrival, hop on a motorboat and admire the island's iconic scenery on a panoramic cruise, passing by the steep cliffs, endless small caves, and the famous Faraglioni rocks, jutting out of the water. Spend time in Capri village with its world-famous piazzetta (little square) and enjoy free time to explore this island paradise of chic boutiques, lush vegetation, and outdoor cafés. Return to the mainland in the late afternoon. *Today breakfast will be included.*

Day 8: Sorrento

This morning, explore another side of Sorrento during a locally guided walking tour, showing off its allure — legend has it that sirens once lured sailors to Sorrento's shores. See why Enrico Caruso, the famous tenor who sung "Torna a Surriento," was so captivated by Sorrento's beauty, he often made it his holiday retreat. Along the way, sample some local flavors and venture down to Marina Grande, Sorrento's old fishing village. Ending by the seaside, linger longer if you wish with time to find lunch on your own at the many restaurants specializing in fish, or dip your feet in the Mediterranean Sea at the small beach before heading back to the main part of town. Enjoy the relaxing beauty of Sorrento during an afternoon at leisure. This evening, gather with your fellow travelers for a farewell dinner and bid *salute* to the end of your Italian getaway. *Today breakfast and dinner will be included.*

Day 9: Sorrento - Tour Ends

Your tour comes to a close today. *Today breakfast will be included.*

Important Tour Information:

The overall activity level of this tour is a level 3. This means you're an on-the-go traveler. You don't want to miss a thing, so walking and standing for longer periods of time (2-3 hours) isn't a big deal. A moderately paced two-and-a-half-hour walking tour, covering several miles, hills, and uneven surfaces, is no problem for you. Walking four miles over the course of a day is very doable, as is climbing into and out of various modes of transportation (tuk-tuk, cable car, zodiac, etc.). You can climb three flights of stairs easily and handle altitudes between 6,000 and 9,000 feet. Expect some longer days with early mornings or late nights balanced with free time to recharge or set out on your own adventure. This level is not a fit for travelers who require mobility assistance devices.

Travel with an average of 37 people (maximum of 44).

Positano is only accessible on foot and requires the ability to climb up and down multiple flights of stairs without the assistance of railings.

You should expect large crowds at each location, with long waiting times at ferry embarkation points where there is no seating available. You will be required to wait in line without seating and under the sun without access to shaded areas.

In Rome, you must be prepared to walk approximately 3 miles (4.8 kilometers) to complete each one of the included guided walking tours, with no opportunity to sit.

Italy imposes strict limits on tour bus circulation, and mandatory drop off and pick up points, especially in historic areas such as Rome, Sorrento, Positano and Amalfi. The same applies for the optional tour sightseeing outlined in the itinerary. All these areas require navigating large crowds, extensive walking over cobblestones, uneven and often narrow sidewalks, and occasionally unpaved terrain with loose gravel.

The archeological site of Pompeii is entirely pedestrianized, and the only access is via a steep ancient Roman street which is uphill and paved with huge, slippery cobblestones. Therefore, the site is not "accessible" by disabled standards. Throughout the archeological site, you will need to negotiate large cobblestones and steep sidewalks. There are NO vehicles inside the site, which is extremely vast.

If you require any special assistance while on tour, please make us aware at time of reservation so the necessary request form can be sent to your attention.

The included activities are not suitable for travelers using motorized scooters, wheelchairs, walkers, or Zimmer-frames.

Days of features are interchangeable.

Most shops and businesses in Italy are closed on Sundays and on national/religious holidays.

**Sailing along the Amalfi Coast is sea and wind dependent. The ferry boats to Positano operate between April 1 and October 31. If you travel to the Amalfi Coast between November 1 and March 31, or in case of adverse weather conditions, the visit will be operated by bus, and you will not visit Positano, which is not accessible by motorcoach. The Amalfi Coast drive is along a very narrow, winding road. Travelers prone to motion sickness and/or seasickness should take the proper precautions.

***The optional boat trip to the isle of Capri is dependent on sea and wind conditions. According to the weather conditions, the ferry boat ride may depart from Sorrento or Naples. The length of the sailing depends on the port of departure, varying between 30 and 50 minutes each way. In case the scenic boat ride around the isle of Capri cannot operate, you will visit Anacapri village instead. Travelers prone to motion sickness and/or seasickness should take the proper precautions.

*During your stay in Sorrento, standard accommodations at the Hilton Sorrento Palace Hotel are in rooms facing the road and hillside. Upgrades to superior rooms with balcony and partial view of the coastline and garden are available at an additional cost. Some departures will be accommodated in other Sorrento hotels which may not offer coastal view upgrades. Please inquire at the time of booking.

Single accommodations are limited and are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Single rate subject to change based on availability.

To complete your tour, we include round-trip airport-to-hotel transfers when purchasing our airfare with your tour. If you have arranged for your own air, we are pleased to provide you the option of purchasing these transfers. Please note that all transfers will leave at pre-scheduled times.

Our air travelers will depart from Naples airport.

For air-inclusive reservations, the name provided at time of booking must match your government-issued ID that will be used during travel. Name changes are subject to penalties.

Please be advised, many airlines do not provide advance seat assignments until check-in at the airport. Advance seating will be subject to the airline's terms and conditions.

Prepaid tipping is not available on our tours therefore payment of customary end-of-trip gratuities for your Tour Manager, driver, local guides, hotel housekeepers, and cruise ship waitstaff should be handled individually when applicable during the course of your tour.

For your well-being, we recommend bringing comfortable, well-broken-in walking shoes.

Travel Requirements:

Passports are required for this tour at your expense. Certain countries require that your passport be valid at least 6 months beyond the dates of your travel. You are strongly urged to contact the appropriate consulate for details. Visit www.travel.state.gov for the U.S. State Department for the latest details about passports and visa requirements.

IMPORTANT: We recommend that travelers take a photocopy of their passport and applicable visas. It should be packed separately from your actual passport and visa. We also recommend leaving a copy at home with your emergency contact.

ETIAS visa waiver requirements are anticipated to begin during the last quarter of 2026, for a fee, when visiting a Schengen Area Country. To identify Schengen Area Countries and to complete the ETIAS application, please visit https://travel-europe.europa.eu/etias_en

Collette will provide all necessary information, updates, and supporting documents for your travel requirements, including visa and Electronic Travel Authorizations (ETAs), if required, approximately 60-90 days prior to your departure.
